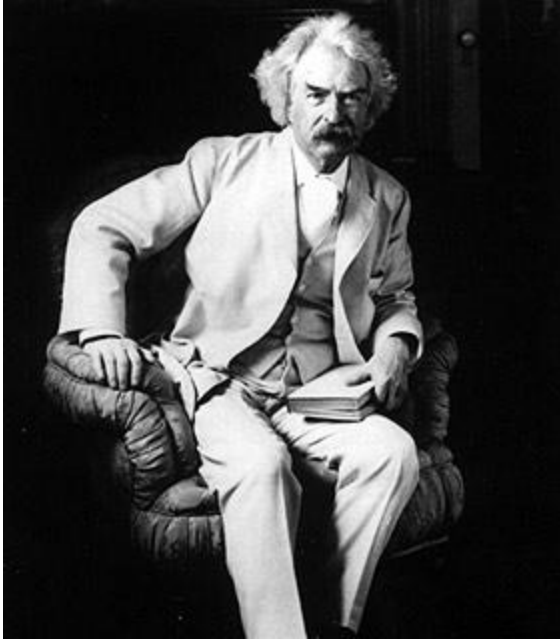


Linguistic Intelligence

Word smart: sensitive to the use of language, write clearly and persuasively.



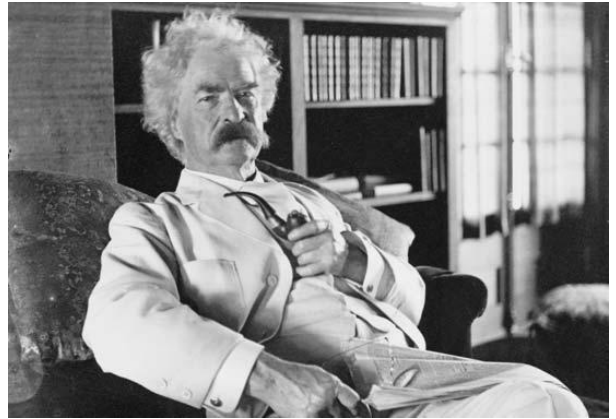
Possible opportunities
